Summary Comments

Things that went well for the instructor/class:

The learning environment was engaging, challenging, collegial, and supportive. While there is no question that the instructor is the expert in the class, she validates students' knowledge, expertise, and contributions, which allows students to learn from each other. She is able to explain complex concepts in terms the students seemed to understand. She gives numerous examples and helps students make connections to prior knowledge. Her questioning techniques are very effective in getting students to think critically and work through problems. She was well prepared and provided multiple ways for students to engage with the material.

Challenges in this particular class:

The only thing that stood out as a potential challenge, was the balance of student participation. In particular, the two women in the course were less likely to ask and answer questions. This was less evident in the second class session.

Specific suggestions for enhancing the learning environment:

To encourage participation from all students, perhaps ask for responses from specific students, or consider incorporating pair or small group work to encourage collaborative learning, such as Think-Pair-Share.
